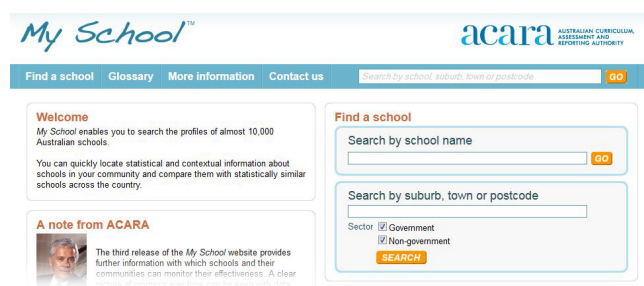

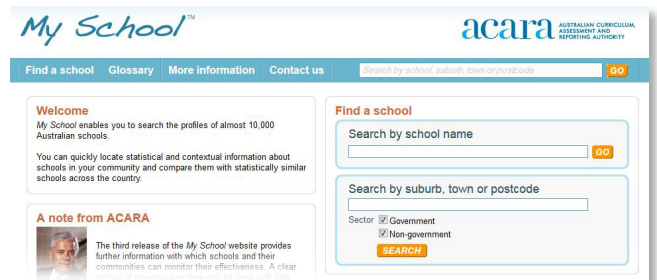
Policy and practice to manage student attendance
